Four co-authors of the White Paper, Mr Edwin Khew, Mr Low Kian Beng, Dr. Sanjay Kuttan, and Mr Christophe Inglin served as panellists. The panel discussion topic was "Unlocking a \$3billion in private investment in renewable energy".

We had a very vibrant and interactive discussion, and a wide range of issues were discussed. One issue was the total quantity of waste available for bioenergy in Singapore – banks were concerned that if there are so many companies in bioenergy, would there be enough waste in Singapore for all the different competitors? Another issue was the low appetite of banks & financial institutions in investing in renewable energy. One way this can be addressed is to review the regulatory framework for intermittent sources of energy which were one of the recommendations in the SEAS white paper, and which the Energy Market Authority of Singapore is already working on. It was a very insightful discussion on some very critical issues pertaining to the growth of the sector and was very useful to most members attending and participating in the discussion.

SEAS also elected a new council for the term 2014-2016. The SEAS council serves to advise the secretariat and SEAS members, also providing support when needed.
